Assets:

Wozo has the following set of assets to draw on:

- A name that is recognized for a successful program (The Wozo brand)
- Twenty (20) and plus experience staff members
- An advisory board
- One hundred and five (105) Wozo clubs, with an estimated 2500 members all over the country.
- Fifteen (15) clubs that are experiencing community problem solving by developing related activities such as; training, cleaning, micro credit, cooperatives, agriculture...
- 3000 persons who completed a week long training
- 30000 persons who attended shorter presentations through schools, churches, communities, radio
- National networking with institution that shares the purpose, mission and vision of Wozo
- Curricula
- A strong network of partners and friends interested in a continuing program
- Members who contributing a yearly residual income (to be updated)
- An equip Monitoring and Evaluation system
- Office equipment and materials
